Recycling Update!

<u>Good news!</u> We are collecting soft plastics again at our Bridge Recycling Station in the church porch. These include: BREAD BAGS, FRUIT AND VEG BAGS, FROZEN FOOD BAGS, PLASTIC WRAPPERS, 'POLYTHENE' BAGS, CEREAL PACKET INNERS, PLASTIC COMPOST BAGS.

If you are not sure whether your items are recyclable please check the recycling advice on the packaging and please make sure they are CLEAN before placing them in the recycling bin.



The plastics will be collected weekly by volunteers who will take them to local supermarkets when they do their shopping. If you would like to volunteer to go on the rota please contact Megan or Jean. Details below.

We are hoping to start collecting pill blister packs and will need volunteers to take them to Superdrug in Canterbury. Contact us if you can help.

On the back of this Newsletter there is a list of places in Canterbury and East Kent where you can take all kinds of used and unwanted items that can be recycled and re-used. If you know of any others – please tell us!

VISIT TO FOREST SCHOOL

In September some of the Team went to Bridge & Patrixbourne Primary School to visit the Forest School, set up in 2021 by Teaching Assistant, Lisa Pearman, to encourage the children to learn more about the environment and how to care for it. This is available to all children in the school as part of the curriculum. They are able to develop their own ideas and have already had success with planting willow domes, flowers, vegetables, herbs and trees and making habitats to attract birds and other wildlife. The Team was impressed



by what has already been achieved and hopes to establish stronger ties with the Forest School.

The Canterbury Repair Cafe is open on the second Saturday of each month 10am to 12.30pm at the Hub Café next to the Baptist Church in St George's Place (opposite Waitrose). Next one is REPAIR CAF Saturday 10th December when there will be a Children's toys, games and books Swap Shop. Bring things to repair or to swap. Everything free!



What is a Repair Café?

'Repair Cafés are free meeting places and they're all about repairing things (together). In the place where a Repair Café is located, you'll find tools and materials to help you make any repairs you need. On clothes, furniture, electrical appliances, bicycles, crockery, appliances, toys, et cetera. You'll also find expert volunteers, with repair skills in all kinds of fields.

Visitors bring their broken items from home. Together with the specialists they start making their repairs in the Repair Café. It's an ongoing learning process. If you have nothing to repair, you can enjoy a cup of tea or coffee. Or you can lend a hand with someone else's repair job. You can also get inspired at the reading table – by leafing through books on repairs and DIY.'
